

DIVINE DECREES

**Isaiah 46:8-10 . . . "Remember this, and be assured; Recall it to mind, you transgressors.
9 "Remember the former things long past, For I am God, and there is no other; *I am* God, and there is no one like Me, 10 Declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things which have not been done, Saying, 'My purpose will be established, and I will accomplish all My good pleasure';**

Isaiah 41:21-23 . . . “Present your case,” the LORD says. “Bring forward your strong arguments,” The King of Jacob says. ²² Let them bring forth and declare to us what is going to take place; As for the former events, declare what they were, That we may consider them, and know their outcome; Or announce to us what is coming. ²³ Declare the things that are going to come afterward, That we may know that you are gods; Indeed, do good or evil, that we may anxiously look about us and fear together.

**Isaiah 41:24 . . . Behold, you are of no account,
And your work amounts to nothing; He who
chooses you is an abomination.**

Isaiah 41:25-26 . . . I have aroused one from the north, and he has come; From the rising of the sun he will call on My name; And he will come upon rulers as *upon* mortar, Even as the potter treads clay." ²⁶ Who has declared *this* from the beginning, that we might know? Or from former times, that we may say, "*He is right!*"? Surely there was no one who declared, Surely there was no one who proclaimed, Surely there was no one who heard your words.

Isaiah 45:21 . . . Declare and set forth *your* case; Indeed, let them consult together. Who has announced this from of old? Who has long since declared it? Is it not I, the LORD? And there is no other God besides Me, A righteous God and a Savior; There is none except Me.
